


MOTHER ABBESS WRITES...On 31 December 1623, nine young Englishwomen, exiled and living in Cambrai, Flanders, were clothed in the habit; a year later, on 1 January 1625, they made solemn profession. The year 2024, then, is the 400th of the life of our community; it is a jubilee year, which we wish to celebrate in a spirit of deep thanksgiving – thanking the Lord for all has given us over four centuries. We have come through times of difficulty and challenge; we are continually graced with very evident blessing. We are filled with the joy of eucharistic abundance. The ancient Hebrews marked the beginning of the year of jubilee by the blast of a ram's horn, yôbēl. It was a proclamation: jubilee acknowledges that everything belongs to God, that all we are and have is gift, given through him and for him. The Hebrews in their jubilee year gave thanks for the particular gift of their land, the holy land. In our year of jubilee, we thank God for our community and for his faithful love which sustains us and gives us life. We won't begin the year by blasting a ram's horn; our celebration will start with the Solemnity of the Holy Mother of God. Mary, as Our Lady of Consolation, is our patron. Under her care and continuing 'consolation' we seek to live as she lives: 'let it be done to me according to vour word.'

We invite you all to share this year of grace with us, to join us in joy and thanksgiving. We wish to thank you for your friendship, communion and support, your encouragement. May Christmas and the coming year 2024 be deeply blessed.

It is almost a quarter of a century since Stanbrook stepped onto the digital platform with its first website, designed by Michael Luke Davis to whom we owe a great debt of gratitude for his creativity and technical help, both from his own company of Native, and later in designing our website at Wass, under the aegis of the Multimedia Studio team at Buckfast Abbey.

The Jubilee Year: Celebrating 400 Years

We are looking forward to celebrating our Jubilee with as many of you as possible. There will be gatherings at Stanbrook throughout 2024: invitations will be issued nearer the dates. On 31 May, Bishop Terence Patrick Drainey of Middlesbrough will celebrate Mass here for our families, friends and oblates, so even if you are unable to be with us in person, you will be remembered in a particular way that day. Two new prayers have been composed: each day at Midday Office we shall pray one written especially for the 400th anniversary and we invite you to pray the Jubilee Prayer printed opposite.

UN PSAUME, UNE ABBAYE ONE PSALM, ONE ABBEY

o discover an abbey is to penetrate into a sacred space. Here God is served, here He has been served, sometimes for centuries. Even today, consecrated persons who have given everything to Christ seek God inhabiting this patch of earth where they work, pray, and celebrate, love, suffer and encounter Jov.

Twelve monasteries of Europe, belonging to the Benedictine, Cistercian, and Premonstratensian traditions, have been lovingly contemplated by the attentive eye of a photographer wanting to get closer to their identity. Each community has chosen a psalm and meditated on it. The styles are very diverse, very personal, as are the buildings, the colours, the landscapes, and the skies.

The aim of this book is to help the reader approach the mystery to which each monastery gives witness according to its own personality. Here then is a Psalter of images and lives, which reflects the manifold incarnations of the inexhaustible word of the Psalms. There is even more here than a celebration of the beauty of monastic life: it is a hymn to Christ, Lord of time and space, and singer of the Psalms, He who dwells in the hearts of nuns and monks, vigilant and passionate seekers of God.
